



The Minister writes:

This is the time of year when we celebrate our harvest festival. As our lives are moving away from being involved in the production of food, it is even more important to reflect on what we eat and where it comes from. A recent survey showed that a third of primary school children thought cheese came from plants and 1 in 5 thought chicken was the principal ingredient in fish fingers.

Food can become a commodity, something we mindlessly consume on our way to doing other things. It's very easy to go to the shops, buy what we want as cheaply as possible, but without any real thought of where our food is coming from. The principles of Fairtrade are important to help each person in the supply chain get a just reward. Our choices of where we shop and what we buy can make a difference

For Christians, food is not a commodity, rather it is God's way of providing for the life of the world. I came across the phrase, "Food is God's love made delectable". The story of creation celebrates the wonder of plants and animals that provide food for each other. A simple way to avoid taking food for granted is to say grace before meals. This was the normal thing to do with the people I stayed with in Africa, and I believe it used to be more usual here. Simply to pause and reflect on the gift of food, to give thanks to our creator and for those who have helped bring the food to the table, gives the right perspective.

As we meditate on our food, we are taken into a deeper mystery. The story of food is one of life and death, whether of plant or animal. This opens up the idea of sacrifice, sacrifice that brings life out of death. As we accept this building block of creation then we are able to move closer to an understanding of the sacrifice of Jesus, who gave his life that we might have life.

We would like to invite you to join in these celebrations of God's good gifts at Harvest. There will be a Ceilidh with a live band on Saturday 12th October at St Peter's School (please see page 10 for details and ring 835746 for tickets), then our Harvest Festival service at 10am on Sunday 13th October. On Tuesday 15th October there will be a harvest lunch open to all in the village but especially aimed at the more mature members of the community (see p11 for further info).

A Legacy for Stanley Public drop-in: Tuesday 29th October, 12pm-7pm

There is an important opportunity for the residents of Stanley to contribute ideas about the legacy of the old church. When the church is demolished, the land will become part of the churchyard, and we would like to give local people the opportunity to be involved in deciding what should happen on the site.

The war memorial will be preserved on the site, but how exactly? There are a number of ideas already: seating, a wild flower garden, a stone outline of the old church, and a 'prayer path'.

Please come along to a public drop-in session on Tuesday 29th October between 12pm and 7pm at St Peter's Church Centre to share your ideas for the site. You can also send your ideas by email to legacy@stpeters-stanley.org.uk. In the New Year, there will be an opportunity to comment on the most popular ideas so that a final decision can be made of which people can be proud.

Posters and leaflets about the drop-in session will be distributed around Stanley over the next few weeks.

The old church has now been empty for 11 years after it proved impossible to restore, or to find a developer to take on the work. After a consultation process, the government ruled in December last year that demolition could go ahead. The expectation is that the church will be demolished in the first part of next year, 2014.

Although it will be very sad to lose the old church, the village has a significant opportunity to come together and decide how the site should be landscaped for use by the community for future generations. It is also an opportunity to consider how a Christian centre should fit in our community, in our lives and in our society. So please, share your thoughts and your ideas and help plan the legacy for Stanley.



Put yourself in the picture

Bill Henderson has invited everyone in the church congregation to become part of the St Peter's jigsaw! Last month, he launched the St Peter's Stewardship campaign which challenges all regular church members to review their contribution to the church; whether in terms of financial giving, or in terms of time and skills offered.

The truth of the matter is that there is a considerable cost to running the church: it currently costs about £1,344 per week to pay the bills, keep the church open, pay our contribution to Wakefield Diocese, and to deliver and develop our ministry in the community.



Therefore, everyone has been asked to review their personal giving to the church. The

Planned Giving scheme promotes regular giving through standing order or by envelope, and is vitally important because it allows the church to plan its ministry based on the financial commitments of its members. The scheme also allows everyone to express their worship to God through regular and committed giving.

As well as reviewing our financial giving, Bill has challenged everyone to review how they use their time and skills to contribute to church life. The church has achieved so much over the past ten years but there is so much more we would like to do: we want to grow our activities for children, young people, and the elderly; develop our care for the bereaved and the sick; extend the role of the café, and offer help for those in need both at home and abroad.

All regular church members have been given a jigsaw piece. Over the next few weeks, everyone has been asked to think about their contribution to church, and to return their jigsaw piece. As everyone brings back their piece, a wonderful picture of the life of St Peter's will take shape. Photographs of the pantomime, summer gala, café and various events have been made into a fantastic jigsaw, which will only be complete when everyone returns their piece.

On Sunday, 13th October at the Harvest Festival service, Bill will lead a celebration of all the wonderful talents, friendships, contributions and people that make up the jigsaw of St Peter's church.



'Nights in Rodanthe' (2009) PG Rating

Based on a novel by Nicholas Sparks, this film is unapologetically sentimental, and enjoyable completely on its own terms; a small gem of an escape, complete with storm-tossed coastline. Diane Lane stars as Adrienne, a wronged wife whose husband (Christopher Meloni) begs for another chance. She goes to clear her head at a remote North Carolina inn, where the sole occupant is Paul, a doctor, played by Richard Gere, who is battling his own demons. Gere and Lane both give superb performances as people of a certain age, who haven't yet given up on love. The cinematography is stunning too: the foamy seas, desolate sand dunes and bleached skies adding to the feelings of loneliness and desolation. This is a beautifully told love story; heartbreaking and captivating.

The Pantomime is coming....
