

## **The Minister writes:**

Last month I wrote that we were starting our latest series of groups for people exploring their faith. The groups have started but it is not too late to join.

The idea of the groups is not to tell people what they should believe, but rather to help explore some of the big questions of life. What is life all about? Where am I going? What is the point of it all? It is all too easy to drift through life without taking time to think through these questions for ourselves. Sometimes life's events bring us up short and prompt us to ask these questions. The Christian story gives a chance to find meaning and purpose, but also to discover the power and comfort of a relationship with a God who loves and cares for us.

A very good friend of ours has recently died. She was a single lady who through a difficult childhood did not have a very good opinion of herself. But she had an amazing faith and concern for other people; a real purpose in her life. Over the years she has been a wonderful prayer warrior for our family and many others. After a conversation about what was happening in our family, she would get a note book and write down the things that needed prayer. She prayed for many families and people every day. When she died we had a thanksgiving service for her life and the church was packed and many people told stories of how she had helped them over the years. She would have been amazed at the number of people who wanted to show their love.

One of the readings at her service was one we had in our first meeting of our 'Just Looking' group. It comes from psalm 139 and talks of God's great love for us: "O Lord, you have examined my heart and know everything about me....You knit me together in my mother's womb. Thank you for making me so wonderfully complex..."

It can be a bit scary to think that God knows everything about us, but comforting to know that he still loves us all the same. Faith gives us the foundation to believe that life is not just a series of random events but that we have a higher purpose. There is a loving God who wants us to know Him too, and a relationship with Him will transform everything. Following Jesus is challenging but the most rewarding thing we can do

After the service there will be a bring and share lunch to which everyone is invited. Come and join us for the Harvest festival service and lunch as we give thanks for God's many gifts us all.







### **Armed Forces Covenant**

The Armed Forces Covenant has been signed by the Archbishops of Canterbury and York, and it sets out the relationship between the nation, the armed forces and the government. It recognises that the whole nation has a moral obligation to members of the armed forces and their families, and it establishes how they should expect to be treated.



At a recent Synod meeting of the Diocese of Leeds, it was agreed that all parishes should be asked to fully endorse this Armed Forces Covenant, and consider how they might engage with those currently serving in HM armed forces and the Reservist and veteran communities and their families.

This item has been duly discussed by the PCC of St Peter's church, and the PCC has agreed wholeheartedly to support the Armed Forces Covenant, and will look into how we might practically apply it in our church and parish.



### **Most popular songs for funerals**

It seems that pop songs have overtaken hymns as the music of choice for funerals. So says a report recently published by undertakers. Frank Sinatra's "My Way" tops the list of popular songs as it becomes less common for mourners to sing hymns. The study among 300 Co-op funeral directors and 2,000 adults also found "The Lord Is My Shepherd", "Abide With Me" and "All Things Bright And Beautiful" remain frequent choices.

Stanley Grove school is delighted to announce that, following their inspection at the end of July, Ofsted has awarded the school a 'Good' rating. The school was rated 'Good' in all categories and the report made some extremely positive comments about our children, and the quality of our teaching. We are very pleased with this result and would like to thank all our staff and pupils for their hard work.

This term, the whole school has had the topic of 'Forests' and all classes have been doing some very exciting work on this topic, both in the classrooms and using our outdoor provision.

This month we have held a very successful Arts Week: all the children came to school in non-uniform, and dressed for the outdoors, and have enjoyed a wonderful range of outdoor art activities. They have been using mud and clay to make sculptures, and have used other items found outdoors such as apples, leaves, flowers etc to make various art works.

At the beginning of term, we held some class meetings for parents to meet their child's teacher and to find out more about what happens in the classroom, and the class plan for the term and the year ahead. We will be continuing with our regular class assemblies, when each class takes it in turns to present to parents and the rest of the school what they have been learning in class.

Our SEAL (Social and Emotional Aspects of Learning) topic this half term is 'new beginnings'. The children have been setting up class rules and discussing their roles and responsibilities in school, particularly with reference to safety, learning and respect.

Stanley Grove were among the winners of a campaign to encourage the recycling of electrical items and our prize was a tablet. In addition, Shanks Waste Management has been working with the school to create an amazing mascot—'Michael Recycle'—which can be seen in our front playground. Michael was created out of various recyclable items including plastic bottles, bottle tops and plastic bags.

This month we will be holding a Harvest Assembly and collecting produce to donate to St Swithun's Court and Wakefield Hospice.

## Winnie the Pooh – a much loved bear

Winnie-the-Pooh was born 90 years ago this month, on 14th October 1926; this was the date on which the world-famous children's book by A. A. Milne was first published.

Technically, Winnie-the-Pooh, also called Pooh Bear, is a fictional anthropomorphic teddy bear hero of a number of books, always illustrated by E. H. Shepard, who therefore gave Pooh his distinctive shape in the mind of the reader. To his many admirers, Pooh is the wise, kind and loving companion they always wanted – a bear of very little brain and with many faults, but whose heart is always in the right place.



The Pooh stories, written originally for the author's only son, Christopher Robin, and set in an area recognisable as Ashdown Forest in Sussex, have been translated into many languages, including a Latin version, 'Winnie ille Pu.'

Though naive and somewhat literal-minded, honey-loving Pooh composes songs and hums and comes up with unexpected solutions to problems. He also invents the game Poohsticks. He has been recommended to Christians for his love toward his friends, such as Piglet, Tigger, Kanga and Rabbit – all modelled on Christopher Robin's soft toys.

Examples of Pooh's wisdom are widely quoted. His refusal to let Piglet worry him can be seen as deeply Christian: "Supposing a tree fell down, Pooh, while we were underneath it?", "Supposing it didn't," said Pooh after careful thought.


