



Dear Friends, Welcome to the May edition of our benefice magazine which again covers lots of news and activities across our four churches. It is good to report that we are now currently advertising for a new associate priest to join the benefice. If all goes to plan we shall be interviewing prospective candidates on Monday June 5th and any news of an appointment will be shared after this. Please continue to pray for all involved in the interview process and for any prospective candidates. Whilst writing can I say a very big thank you to various people from across the benefice who have worked together extremely well with Peter Townley our archdeacon to produce a very professional brochure and advert.

Turning now to the Coronation when on Saturday 6th May His Majesty King Charles III is crowned. The Coronation will be a historic moment in the life of our nation, a time to reflect on our history, reflect and celebrate something of who we are, and look forward. The coronation is steeped in this country's traditions and filled with great symbolism. It is essentially a consecration to service. Happening within a Eucharist, the most basic and the central act of Christian worship, it includes oaths, regalia and crowning. Through it we receive from Jesus the one who comes to us as a servant; the one who is the king of Kings.

There will be additions to the service from the one in 1953 and these will reflect the rich cultural and religious diversity of our national life. For instance faiths other than Christian will play a part which reflect the King's commitment to respecting all faiths. Also we shall all be encouraged to cry out and swear allegiance to the King and female clergy will play an active part. Justin Welby said the coronation was 'first and foremost an act of Christian worship' and that his 'prayer is that all who share in this service, whether they are of faith or no faith, will find ancient wisdom and new hope that brings inspiration and joy".

So dear friends, however you choose to mark the Coronation weekend, I hope this will be a time celebrating God's love and generosity, and making that love known in our communities and national life. I leave you with a prayer that will be used at church services throughout the land....

Almighty God, the fountain of all goodness, bless our Sovereign Lord, King Charles, and all who are in authority under him; that they may order all things in wisdom and equity, righteousness and peace, to the honour of your name, and the good of your Church and people; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Monday 8th May: Big Help Out bank holiday with people encouraged to volunteer their time and take part in community and charity events.



The Coronation of King Charles III

Bob Dylan's 'Blowin' in the Wind'

Sixty years ago, on 27th May 1963, the folk/blues album 'The Freewheelin' Bob Dylan' was released. It included the hit song Blowin' in the Wind and marked the start of an amazing singing-songwriting career. It was Bob Dylan's second album, but the first to contain all his own songs. He came to prominence in the protest movement of the 60s, latching on to the prevailing atmosphere with a catalogue of songs that were not only perceptive but revealed an entirely different kind of talent, from the manner of his delivery to the poetic invention of his lyrics.

Dylan's birth name was Robert Allen Zimmerman. He was born in Minnesota, descended from Jewish immigrants from Ukraine and Lithuania. His career stalled for a short while following a motorcycle accident in the mid-60s, but he came back strongly and unexpectedly with the wonderful country-tinged album, 'John Wesley Harding'. In the late 1970s he became a Christian and issued several overtly Christian albums, starting with 'Slow Train Coming', but he eventually reverted to a more open style, though he never renounced his faith: it seems evident in his recordings up to the present day.

Although now in his 80s, he has never stopped performing or writing, usually to the highest standards. His more recent albums, such as 'Time out of Mind' and 'Rough and Rowdy Ways' (his 39th studio album, issued in 2020), show just as much invention and creativity as ever.

How an argument over tea led to the founding of America


Some 250 years ago, on 10th May 1773, Britain passed the Tea Act, which favoured the British East India Company over the American colonies. This led to the Boston Tea Party in December, which escalated into the American Revolution and the establishment of the USA.

The idea of the Tea Act was to help the struggling British East India Company to dispose of its vast holdings of tea profitably in the American colonies, where much of the (inferior) tea came from Dutch sources and was smuggled in. But the colonists reacted strongly against the attempt to manipulate their tea-buying, and against British taxes generally, which they regarded as taxation without representation.

Later the same year this led to what has become known as the Boston Tea Party, where a large group of citizens, calling themselves the Sons of Liberty and dressed as Mohawk Indians, boarded the British tea ships and threw 92,000 pounds of tea into the harbour.

This was not a violent insurrection. No-one was injured, and it was reported that the Sons of Liberty swept the decks of the ships afterwards. But British politicians of all sides were appalled, not least because many of them had substantial holdings in the British East India Company.

Added to the ill-feeling resulting from the Boston Massacre in 1770, in which five people died after British troops had been taunted, this led in two short years to the American War of Independence, which changed everything.


