



Dear Friends, Welcome to a bumper edition of the Benefice magazine which covers both July and August – again thanks to all who have contributed.

I have always been a keen tennis fan; I played for many years but also enjoy following the game as it circumnavigates the globe during the year. When you play singles it is quite a lonely experience as you pit yourself against the other player as you seek victory. There were never any crowds or coaches offering advice at my level! Anyway I was thinking about tennis singles, and how you are own your own, and how it compares to life in church. There are many examples in the Bible about how we are

called to work together and share our gifts to build up the body of Christ. It is when we work together and share in worship and prayer that

we realise we can do far more together than on our own.

This working together was very much in evidence on Saturday 17th June when we gathered as a benefice in St Peter's Church, Stanley, to hear from each church about their life and ministry. For me it was very uplifting to hear about the number of projects that are on the go across the four churches, and to see the energy and enthusiasm on show. We

also met in different groups to think about areas of our shared lives that we could develop. Lots of good ideas came out of the groups, but of course, we can't work on everything at the same time! However, all the suggestions have been noted down and the next stage will be to discuss over the summer how some projects could be launched in the autumn. Here's a flavour of some of the ideas we shall be taking forward:

- 1. On Tuesday 11th July from 7pm there is a meeting at the Alverthorpe vicarage for fellowship, and to discuss house groups, prayer groups and outreach. Also, see the St Anne's page for details of a new women's group starting 16th September.
- 2. We will look at how some key church services could be joint services for the benefice e.g. Ash Wednesday, Ascension Day etc. Also look at the formation of a worship group that could deliver key services like Harvest across the benefice.
- 3. Social events: maybe each church could organise a social event during the year.
- 4. We have a number of children and young people's groups—we could meet up now and then to share good practice etc.

Overall, the challenge is to discover areas of life we can share that is sustainable, measured and responsible. Sadly, church life across the board is facing financial pressures, and with few clergy as well as decreasing numbers in our pews, we face a challenging future. God hasn't given up on us though! Just read the story of Jesus feeding the 5,000 and see what he can do with just a few loaves of bread and fish! It will be through prayer, openness to God's Spirit and working together that God will continue to bless us as we seek to be a beacon of light and hope to those we serve and live.

So dear friends, please keep praying, and watch this space for more details about our plans for the future. Also keep praying for a new Associate Priest to join us.


School news



Henry Moore and his monumental sculptures

Henry Moore, the British sculptor and illustrator best known for his monumental semi-abstract bronze sculptures, was born 125 years ago, on 30th July 1898, in nearby Castleford. He knew he wanted to be a sculptor from an early age, having heard at Sunday school about Michelangelo's life and work. But his parents regarded sculpture as manual labour, and he trained as a teacher before

joining the Army during WW1. An ex-serviceman's grant brought him, via Leeds School of Art, to the Royal College of Art in London, where he met and later married Irina Radetsky.

During WW2, Moore became popular as a war artist, mainly through his drawings. But in 1943 he was commissioned to carve a Madonna and Child for the Church of St Matthew in Northampton. His fame as a sculptor grew quickly, with exposure in the media backed up by major exhibitions in London and



Florence. In 1977, at the age of 79, he established the Henry Moore Foundation, to encourage "enjoyment and opportunity" in the arts, especially sculpture. The Foundation now runs his house and estate at Perry Green, Hertfordshire.

His work was not without controversy. An early 'modernist' sculpture bought by artist and poet Roland Penrose in 1937 for his Hampstead garden aroused some indignation. Then in 1962, Moore, being a socialist, sold another statue to London County Council at a fraction of its value so that it could enrich the lives of those living in a socially deprived area. It was installed on the Stifford council estate but was moved to the Yorkshire Sculpture Park in 1997 after being vandalised. YSP was founded in 1977 by Sir Peter Murray, and Moore was its first Patron; he promised that there would always be a display of his work there.

Summer Gala- a review



Even the BBC couldn't find the Loch Ness Monster

Twenty years ago, on 27th July 2003, a BBC team reported that the Loch Ness monster did not exist. They had combed every inch of the loch, using 600 sonar beams guided by satellite navigation, and found nothing. The operation was covered in the BBC One documentary, 'Searching for the Loch Ness Monster'.

Reported sightings of the monster had led to speculation that it might be a plesiosaur, a marine reptile from the age of the dinosaurs. The BBC team hoped the air in Nessie's lungs would be detected by the instruments on their search boat.



"We went from shoreline to shoreline, top to bottom... we covered everything in this loch, and we saw no signs of any large living animal," said Ian Florence, one of the specialists who carried out the survey for the BBC.

The earliest report of a monster involved the Celtic monk St Columba in the sixth century AD. He was said to have banished a monster from the River Ness into the loch. In 1933 the local paper reported a sighting by a water bailiff, and later that year published a photograph taken by Hugh Gray, and another by surgeon Robert Wilson in 1934. But the BBC report did not kill off interest. Nessie continues to be sighted, and the Loch Ness Centre in Drumnadrochit, near the shores of the loch, has just reopened following a major transformation.


