





Dear Friends, Welcome to our February edition of the North Wakefield Benefice magazine. Again a big thanks to Ellie for producing the magazine and to our contributors – please keep the items coming in so that we can share our news and advertise up and coming events and social activities.

Looking forward, February begins as usual with the presentation of Christ in the Temple which will be celebrated in our churches on Sunday 4th February. This is a wonderful service as we eavesdrop on Simeon and Anna as they meet baby Jesus in the temple. At the service we take one look back at the Christmas CANDLEMAS



and Epiphany tide before turning our gaze upon Lent and our journey towards Holy Week and Easter. There will be Ash Wednesday services in all the churches on Wednesday 14th February – look at the newsletters for details.

This Lent there is an opportunity to meet up and discover together what does it mean to 'live a Christian life'. If you remember last Lent we looked at some of the building blocks of the Christian faith which consist of prayer, bible reading, belonging to church and sharing in worship and holy communion. When you read the gospel stories of Jesus, he calls people to follow him and to view the world and people through his eyes. It is not always easy following in the footsteps of Jesus but by doing so we discover what it means to live life in abundance and know we are truly loved by God the Father. You only have to think that at the end of each service we are dismissed with 'go in peace to love and serve the Lord' - in other words go and share the good news and work together to transform the world to reflect God's kingdom values. Do have a look at the venues and consider joining us as we share and discuss what it means to live a Christian life....

There will be two groups both on a Tuesday starting on the 20th February: 2:30pm in the choir vestry at St Mary Magdalene, Outwood and the other at 7:30pm at Libby's home in Stanley. We shall also touch on the material at the mid week communion services at Alverthorpe and Wrenthorpe.

Whilst writing it is lovely to announce that the post of associate priest will be advertised from the 20th February with interviews taking place on Tuesday 23rd April. Do continue to pray and that this time round we shall fill the vacancy! Again many thanks to everybody who is helping and supporting the life and ministry of the benefice as we enter into the second year of vacancy.



Celebrating 200 years of St Peter's

This year, we are excited to be celebrating 200 years of Christian worship in Stanley! We will give thanks for everyone who has been part of St Peter's, whether in the old or current church buildings, serving both God and the community. We are planning a whole year of activities and events, with a special service on 8th September to be attended by the Bishop of Leeds.

The original St Peter's church was opened on 6th September 1824, but then greatly damaged in a fire in 1911. It reopened in 1913, but there were serious structural flaws and subsidence causing the church be permanently

closed in 2001 and then demolished in 2014.

Since 2001, the congregation has thrived in our current location, with a more practical building and car park. This has enabled us to develop our community activities, whilst keeping our focus on God in all that we do.

Candlemas—2nd February

Candlemas falls on 2nd February, exactly 40 days after Christmas Day. In Biblical times, 40 days old was an important age for a baby boy: it was when they made their first 'public appearance'. Mary, like all good Jewish mothers, took Jesus, her

first male child to the Temple to 'present Him to the Lord'. Thus, the day is also known as the Presentation of Christ in the Temple.



The New Testament describes Jesus as the Light of the World, and early Christians would light candles in celebration of this special day in Jesus' young life. The Church fell into the custom of blessing the year's supply of candles on this day – hence the name, Candlemas.

St Valentine's Day was established by Pop Gelasius 1 in 496 AD, and is named after the Christian martyr Valentine of Rome who was martyred about 269. The first recorded association of Valentine Day with romantic love (1382) is from Geoffrey Chaucer. He wrote, *'For this was Saint Valentine's Day, when every bird cometh there to choose his mate.'* This poem was in honour of the first anniversary of the engagement of King Richard II of England to Anne of Bohemia.

Shakespeare includes a reference to Valentine Day in Hamlet: Ophelia says "To-morrow is St Valentine's day, all in the morning betime, and I a maid at your window to be your Valentine."



The modern mention of Valentine's Day can be found in a collection of English nursery rhymes (1784): "The rose is red, the violet's blue, the honey's sweet, and so are you. Thou are my love and I am thine, I drew thee to my Valentine."




Prayer for February 2024

Tea is the drink of getting things done: Speaking recently on Radio 4, James May, the former Top Gear presenter declared: "I'm just worried that the cult of coffee is going to destroy tea. And I don't like coffee, it is just rubbish. I like tea. Tea is the drink of getting things done." How did tea get so embedded in UK culture? It dates back to the Industrial Revolution of the mid-18th century when tea became less expensive and wages were falling, meaning that people struggled to afford food, fuel or a hot meal. Tea became a way of having something hot and restorative, often with sugar. And so tea became central to the diet of the working poor. James May argues that tea drinking is still fundamental to "bringing



everyone together and ensuring happiness as well as productivity. Tea in the British workplace is more than a drink, it's a social glue. Britain is falling apart because we don't drink enough tea."



Supporting charities at home and abroad

Every year, St Peter's church makes a commitment to support a number of charitable causes. During 2023, the church, with the support of its congregation and community groups, donated almost £5,000 to the following charitable causes. Thank you everyone for your generosity:

- The church gave a total of £1,200 during the year to The Cross Project, which runs lunch clubs, religious education lessons and after-school activities in local secondary schools.
- £800 was given to the DEC Turkey-Syria Earthquake Appeal; some of this was raised through a special collection. The appeal supports those affected by the devasting earthquake on the Turkey/ Syria border in February 2023. Over 300,000 buildings were 🛞 🕽 destroyed, leaving thousands homeless.
- £550 was given to the Mara Safe House in northern Tanzania which provides a refuge and education to young women who are at risk from FGM.
- £300 was give to CAP Care Wakefield to help with the meals and support they offer to the homeless in Wakefield. We also passed on most of the



food that was donated at our Harvest Festival service. We have also been collecting toiletries for CAP and have so far handed over several large bags of toiletries.

- £300 was given to Getaway Girls, the Leeds based charity supporting young women to learn new skills, resilience, confidence and more.
- £275 was raised at our Macmillan Cancer Care coffee morning.
- £260 was raised at our annual wine tasting evening and Alzheimer Society donated to the Alzheimer's Society.
- Against Dementia • £105 was given to Stanley Residents group to purchase a hanging basket for our village. The church also contributed £1,000 towards the cost of the wonderful Heritage Board that has been erected on the old church site.



• The Christmas presents donated at our St Nicholas service were given to the Salvation Army to distribute to children in our local area. The Tuesday lunch club also gave donations of £165 from their Christmas lunch to the Salvation Army.

Bolero—Olympic skating history

Forty years ago, on 14th February 1984, figure skaters Jayne Torvill and Christopher Dean won the gold medal in ice dancing at the Winter Olympics in Sarajevo and became the highest scoring figure skaters of all time. They received twelve perfect 6.0s for artistic impression for their routine to Ravel's Bolero.

Their performance was voted number 8 in a Channel 4 poll of the top 100 Greatest Sporting Moments.

The pair turned professional after Sarajevo and won the world professional



championships five times. In 2000 they were made OBEs for their outstanding contributions to skating and to British sport.
