

The origin of our Palm Crosses

On Sunday 24th March at 10am we will celebrate Palm Sunday, the triumphant arrival of Jesus into Jerusalem, and wave our palm crosses!

St Peter's buys its palm crosses from African Palms, an organisation set up by Rev Alan Talbot in 1969 to give people living in southern Tanzania a chance to earn some extra money. Rev Talbot, who died in 2018 at the age of 95, had worked as a priest in a remote area of the Masasi Diocese in Tanzania in the 1960's when he came up with the idea of helping the villagers to earn extra money by making palm crosses.

The palm crosses are now sold all over the world from the UK, Canada and Hong Kong, helping give dignity to people by allowing them to earn their own money, and also investing in education and healthcare projects.

African Palms also sells beautiful handmade tote bags, see www.africanpalms.co.uk to order, or the leaflet on the noticeboard in church.

Proposed Castle Gate development in Stanley

Last month, a public consultation event was held at St Peter's about a proposed commercial development on Aberford Road and Castle Gate. It would cover a large area from the fields opposite Kingsland School on Aberford Road across to the existing depot on Castle Gate. The boundary to the south would be the footpath that goes from Aberford Road across the fields to Lee Moor, and it would stretch right up to the M62 to the north, taking over all the riding school land.

Our local councillors are aware of the proposed development and attended the consultation event. They are concerned about its impact on the environment and heritage, given the loss of green land and the likely significant increase in traffic on Castle Gate and Aberford Road.

They expect that there will be the opportunity to make formal comments and objections later this month. See www.egniol.com for details of the development including maps, and to give your feedback on the proposal.



Dear Friends, I don't know if you, like me, sometimes find it hard to watch or listen to our rolling news coverage. These days we have 24 hours news and with such detail and analysis it can be painful to always keep abreast. I am reminded of the quote by TS Elliot who said 'humankind cannot bear very much reality' and I feel I have to be careful to balance news intake which can often be sad and graphic alongside some life affirming news. It is easy for us to switch off the television or radio but for many people caught up in struggles in places like the Ukraine and the Middle East, there's no button to press. Rather the worry and constant threat on the doorstep lives with you each moment of every day and night. We remember the people caught up in these wars in our prayers of course but sometimes you feel helpless against such powerful forces moulding countries and people's lives.

When one reads the Bible you find it really brings home to us the reality of the world we live in. Along with wonderful examples of people supporting and caring for one another, we also read about the darker side of humanity and how it can destroy lives and communities.



During Lent we continue our own journey of repentance and self examination and are challenged to look deep into our hearts and lives about how we can help build a better world for all. In many ways it starts with us, and sin at its root cause is alienation from God and each other. As we journey towards the events of Holy Week which begin on Palm Sunday, 24th March, we shall then listen and reflect on those events that shaped the world. We shall eavesdrop on the events of the Last Supper, sit at the foot of the cross on Good Friday and then come to Easter Day to celebrate and rejoice that Jesus has risen. What an amazing God who comes and shares our lives in Jesus and in doing so invites us into a relationship with him.

Perhaps as preparation for our journey through Holy Week, I would encourage you to spend some time reading one of the Gospel accounts of the events of Jesus' last week and ask God to speak to you in a deep and meaningful way.

Also whilst writing please continue to pray for the post of associate priest which is now being advertised. The interviews will take place on Tuesday 23rd April and we pray that this time we shall be able to appoint a new team member. Again a big thanks to all who continue to help and support the work and ministry across the benefice.

Take care and God Bless and hope to see you over the Easter period and consider joining us at various services and events.

As humbly down that path He trod.


The crowd that cheered Him once with palms



Update from Stanley Residents Group

Another "Hello" again from Stanley Residents Group. It's that time of year again when we start thinking of flowers and we need to get our order in for the hanging baskets for the village.

This year brought us some problems with the permits we need in order to use the lampposts and left us with a more than a little doubt about whether we would be able to organise them. 30 years since the ordination of women

It was 30 years ago this month, on 12th March 1994, that the first 32 women were ordained as priests in the Church of England. The service was officiated by Bishop Barry Rogerson at Bristol Cathedral. Bishop Rogerson ordained the women in alphabetical order, so Angela Berners-Wilson was the very first woman to be ordained. She was a university chaplain.

Bishop Rogerson reckoned it would take 10 years before the first woman would be ordained as a bishop. In fact, it took 21 years. Libby Lane was ordained the first female bishop in the Church of England. She became Bishop of Stockport, a suffragan bishop in the Diocese of Chester. The first woman to be ordained a diocesan bishop was the Rt Revd Rachel Treweek, Bishop of Gloucester, appointed on 26 March 2015. There are currently 25 women bishops in the Church of England.

Happy Birthday Barbie!

It was 65 years ago, on 9th March 1959 that the Barbie doll was first launched at the International Toy Fair in New York City. Barbie is arguably the world's most popular doll; more than a billion have been sold since 1959, and more than 100 are sold every minute.



Barbie was the brainchild of Ruth Handler, who co-founded the Mattel toy company with her husband in 1945. She wanted an adult doll that would inspire girls in the same way action figures of firefighters and soldiers encourage boys. Barbie was designed by Jack Ryan, an engineer who worked on guided missile systems used by the US military. He developed her iconic twisting waist and bendable knee joints that clicked. In 1961 Mattel launched Barbie's boyfriend, Ken. (The Handler's children were named Barbara and Ken.)

In 1980, an African American and a Latino version of Barbie was launched. Her first 'job' was as a fashion model. Since then, she's had more than 250 careers, including surgeon, serving in the military, and astronaut.

The Design Museum in London is holding an exhibition this summer, to tell the story of "one of the most recognisable brands on the planet."

Crufts Dog Show, 7th - 10th March

Crufts is the greatest dog show in the world! Last year, more than 155,000 visitors flocked to the NEC in Birmingham for a show the four days show, to see 24,000 dogs from more than 200 breeds in displays of agility and obedience.

Crufts was established in 1891, and named after its founder, Charles Cruft, who was a travelling salesman for Spratts, a dog food company. The job brought him into contact with large country estates and many sporting kennels, both in the UK and in France. In 1878 he was asked to organise the promotion of the canine section of the Paris Exhibition.

Back in England, he took over the running of the Allied Terrier Club Show, and in 1891 the first Cruft's show was held at the Royal Agricultural Hall in Islington.


